



Meeting Minutes – 9/8/99

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Ted Cox at 7:00 P.M, at the Fire Hall. A Quorum was NOT present.

- Carol Symonds reported that \$1500 was in an account for the Mhari Cunningham memorial.
- Ted Cox reported that the remains of the Community Center have been torn down, and is scheduled to be burned on Monday.
- Ted Cox announced the donation of a classic car to the Community Council for fundraising purposes
- There was a general discussion about a new Community Center building, building security, trails, trail-related facilities, and possible uses for grant money.
- Ted Cox reminded the council that the grant money must be committed by June 30th.
- Mrs. Marley of Maud Road voiced concern over reckless drivers and speeding that occurs during parties past the end of Maud Road. Several possible solutions were discussed, including placing staggered boulders on the road to slow traffic.
- Larry DeVilbiss stated that the Borough Assembly is waiting for direction from Community Councils regarding partying issues. Ted Cox suggested that the Council write a letter to the Borough about the problem. Mike Shields volunteered to look into the issue.
- Larry DeVilbiss brought up the issue of the trail along the Old Glenn Highway. Ted Cox said that Enstar had recently graded it, and that the capital improvement plan calls for upgrade of the trail, which is owned by the state.
- Carol Symonds mentioned investigating liability for the playground.
- Ted Cox reminded the council of the Cleanup scheduled for October 16th and 17th.
- Ted Cox stated that there were three vacancies on the Council board.
- Laurie Courtney gave an update on Assembly activity.
